



This document supplements the agreed Behaviour Policy which was ratified by the Management Committee and provides guidance for the safe running of the school during the Covid-19 restrictions only.

1. All pupils continue to be encouraged to take responsibility for their own actions both in and out of school and to consider the impact of their actions upon themselves and others. This is particularly linked to behaviour during full lockdown and as the measures are reduced. Parents will be expected to reinforce government guidelines about social distancing and support school to maintain this while their child is in school.
2. The Aims of this appendix are the same as that of the full policy.
3. Initial searches will be carried out by staff who have the option of wearing appropriate PPE. This may also be worn by pupils who are anxious about attending. As per current government guidance on PPE.
4. Guidance will be provided to ensure that contact between pupils is reduced. Pupils will be encouraged to arrive on and leave the site promptly.
5. Pupils whose behaviour becomes dysregulated will be spoken to in an effort to encourage de-escalation. Pupils who cannot be de-escalated will be asked to leave the school building and site. They will not be able to return that day. Parents will be informed of events at this point. RPI will only be used to guide pupils out of the building, where they will be monitored and parents informed, this is to keep close contact under 15 minutes as per government guidelines. If it proved difficult to remove pupils from the building and staff have to restrain for longer than 15 minutes a priority 999 call will be made. Office staff will be informed that this needs to happen and give the details that staff are having to restrain and this is breaking Covid-19 guidelines, no other information will be necessary, this should ensure that the police are here in less than 15 minutes. As this is happening two more members of staff will immediately don full PPE equipment to relieve the members of staff that are engaged in the initial RPI, this has to happen well within the first 15 minutes.
6. Pupils who refuse to leave the school building/site will be warned about the consequences of this choice and parents will be informed. If they still continue to refuse the police will be called. Parents will be told this has happened.
7. The offer of education for pupils will be reviewed daily in order to ensure the correct procedures have been followed and all 'near miss' incidents are properly reviewed. Strategies may need to be amended in light of events.
