Curriculum Map - Subject: KS3 Art

<u>Aim</u> – To give all pupils the opportunity to develop their understanding of artists, art movements, techniques/skills in a broad variety of media. Pupils will then use this knowledge to refine and experiment with a range of materials and composition styles. They will record their study work through their sketchbook, annotating and analysing where appropriate. Pupils are expected to produce a final piece of work at the end of each topic which clearly demonstrates the learning journey and critical thinking.

Impact – Pupils will have been given the opportunity to produce artwork in mixed media, both 2D and 3D in response to and based on research gathered on festivals from another culture. They will have gained knowledge and learnt new key terminology associated with the DOTD festival, Pupils will show a clear developmental journey of this understanding both though their research as well as the completion of the final outcome. They will have been given the opportunity to develop their skills in relief sculptural techniques and apply surface design that reflects the bright stylized features of Pop art. Their ideas in three-dimensional form will show their deepening understanding of colour theory whilst considering colour and pattern. Pupils will have gained an understanding in construction techniques that are appropriate for the materials used.
