# Curriculum Map - Subject: KS4 Art

<u>Aim</u> – To give all pupils the opportunity to further develop their understanding of artists, art movements, techniques/skills in a broad variety of media, building on from KS3. Pupils will then use this deepening knowledge to refine and experiment with a range of familiar materials and composition styles. They will record their study work through their sketchbook, annotating and analysing where appropriate. Pupils are expected to produce a final piece of work at the end of each topic which clearly demonstrates the learning journey and critical thinking.

They will shape wire to create facial features. They will look at the Cubists. They will work with others.

## Cross-Hatching -

Pupils will develop a better understanding of how to use cross-hatching when drawing. They will use layers of cross-hatching when drawing a human hand and use directional line to make drawings appear 3D.

## Layering Line -

Pupils will develop their drawing when using line.

#### Expressive Line -

Pupils will understand how to use expressive line in the style of Vincent van Gogh.

They will experiment with a variety of lines, dots and swirls when painting with watercolours, They will reflect on the work of others and learn to give constructive feedback.

#### AO2 & AO3

Natural Form-

Pupils will understand how to create a wax-resist technique.

They will use previous knowledge to draw from observation to create a wax resist technique and experiment with line, shape and colour.

#### AO4

Observational Drawing-

Pupils will develop their observational drawing skills.

They will follow step by step instructions and draw their own shoe from observation. They will learn perspective when drawing still life.

Final Project – Still Life Pupils will create a block print to portray a specific subject personal to them, (social or political – looking at the work of Banksy)
They will portray a message through an image and develop print to repeat.

### Lino Printing-

Pupils will develop a lino print based on nature and the work of William Morris.

They will create a pattern that combines a range of images from nature, carve marks that will show a clear pattern image and produce a repeat pattern.

### Screen Printing –

Pupils will create a screen print inspired by Pop Art and consumable products.

They will design an image using bold print and colour.

## Collagraph Printing -

Pupils will select appropriate materials to create a textured surface to produce a collagraph plate.

They will use appropriate found objects to support a creation of an abstract piece of art that will include texture.

#### AO4

Pupils will produce a series of prints based on the techniques learnt during this topic.

<u>Impact</u> – Pupils will have used a range of techniques and media.

Pupils will have studied different styles of architecture and art history.

Pupils will have learnt about modern artistic movements up to present day.

Using a range of materials including inks, watercolours and different tools, create papers showing textures suitable to create a relief collage. Paying attention to colours found in exotic birds. Develop work through using different compositions and assessing what works well. Making improvements where needed to enhance aesthetic. Note health and safety when handling cutting tools. Assembling templates to form 3D object.

#### AO3

Record evidence for sketchbooks.

#### AO4

Develop pupil's analysis of their own artwork through evaluation questions that show higher level thinking and responses. Pupils to reflect on the techniques used in the project.

Impact – Pupils will have created a final piece of three-dimensional collage, which will reflect their understanding of the artist Frank Stella and the use of new techniques learnt during this topic.

Impact – Pupils will have learnt to analyse and evaluate their own work and that of others, in order to strengthen the visual impact or application of their work.		
They will have understood how to use a range of techniques and media, including painting.		
They will have an increased proficiency in handling different materials.		
Pupils will have used a range of techniques to record their observations in their sketchbooks.		
Pupils will understand about the history of art, craft, design and architecture, including periods, styles and major movements from ancient times.
