A family tragedy sets 16-year-old Jacob journeying to a remote island off the coast of Wales, where he discovers the crumbling ruins of Miss Peregrine's Home for Peculiar Children. They may have been guarantined on a Home for Peculiar deserted island for

good reason. And somehow - impossible though it seems - they may still be alive.
