## Prevent Duty Risk Assessment Tool and Action Plan 2024/25

The UK National Threat Level - The current threat to the UK from terrorism is SUBSTANTIAL, an attack is likely (as OF 16.10.24). The threat level reflects the threat from all forms of terrorism regardless of which ideology inspires it and considers the threat from Islamist Terrorism (IT), Extreme Right-Wing Terrorism (ERWT) and Left Wing, Anarchist and Single-Issue Terrorism (LASIT).

The threat to the UK stems from, Self-Initiated (S-IT) Terrorist acting in support of Islamist or Extreme Right Wing. The Islamist Terrorism is currently the largest terrorist threat faced by the UK, (Three quarters of the threat to the UK). The Extreme Right-Wing Terrorism, (ERWT) represents almost a quarter of the threat to the UK.

Online extremism plays an increasingly prominent role in the way in which radicalisation occurs.

Age (where known) – Those aged 15 to 20 accounted for the largest proportion of referrals, 32%, this is in line with the previous year. The second largest group was those aged 14 and under who accounted for 31% followed by those aged 21 to 30 — 14%. Gender (where known) – 90% of referrals were for males in the year ending 31 March 2023.
